

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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE CONTINUED

While we are maintaining many COVID safety protocols, I am pleased our School District, the Pandemic Task Force and the Department of Health have allowed for athletics and arts programs to continue. Clubs are primarily meeting virtually for now and for students who are thinking about joining a club, this would be a good time to consider getting involved in the monthly meetings to see what it's all about. 

North came in second place in the county's voter registration competition. Students were able to register to vote right here on campus!


