# ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE CONTINUED

Students are considered on-time and present for their 1st block class (1st or 2nd period) when they are in the classroom at 7:05am to begin instruction. Students who are not present in class at 7:05am are to report to Student Services to obtain a tardy pass. Students accumulating three (3) or more tardies in a quarter will receive a consequence. Please see the chart below for escalating consequences:

6th tardy to school	All day time-out in Center for Corrective Action
Additional tardies beyond six (6)	All day time-out in Center for Corrective Action

<sup>\*</sup>Please refer to the Student Code of Conduct for 6-12 Grade for more information. Tardies reset each quarter.

If a student is not present when attendance is taken, teachers will mark students Absent Unexcused. If a student is not present in class and their absence needs to be excused, parents are to email 0311.Attendance@LeeSchools.net; please refer to the Code of Conduct for Students, Board Policy 4.16, and the NFMHS Student Handbook found on the our school website for reasons accepted as excused. Students sent home due to a COVID-19 related illness or quarantine are marked present using a Google Classroom (Q) code for the time period they are under quarantine. This code signifies a present code, however, they are not physically present on campus. Students with a Q code are expected to participate in instruction through assignments posted on Google Classroom. If a student is too ill to participate in class, parents or guardians are instructed to contact the Attendance Secretary, Ms. Welch, using the 0311.Attendance@LeeSchools.net email so she can update the attendance to Absent Excused. Chronic and habitual tardiness and poor attendance will result in a contact by me, our school Social Worker, and out School Counselors so appropriate interventions can be implemented.

Lack of regular school attendance may result in loss of credit and driving privileges. If you have any questions about attendance, please contact your child's teachers, their School Counselor, Ms. Welch, Mrs. Rey-Gomez (School Social Worker), or me. Our team is available to support your student and family.

-We had our FIRST IN-PERSON SGA meeting on October 14th, which was held after school until 2:30! We discussed Movie Knight plans, and other general SGA information.


December Spirit Week (More Info Above!)


