It is by no means an exhaustive list, but it at least highlights some areas that families and staff sometimes wonder about, and I hope it will give you a source of confidence that school safety is something that our NFMHS staff takes very seriously.

Safety Initiatives at NFMHS:

- Drills 2 to 3 drills per month: fire, assailant, tornado, bomb, bus evacuation
- Drill "after-action" Review Team
- Crisis Response Team
- Mental Health Team
- School Threat Assessment Team
- Annual Florida Safe Schools Assessment with on-site safety tours by LCSO and NFMFD
- Annual Emergency Operations Plan
- Annual Student Supervision Plan
- Monthly Department Head PLC includes a Safety Team
- New cameras installed: we have over 300 cameras covering everywhere on campus
- New magnetic swipe doors, doorbells & door windows to fortify main office, guidance office & student service entry points
- All gates & doors are either attended or locked
- All exterior gates serviced immediately after Hurricane Ian to ensure safe campus perimeter
- Fortify Florida anonymous tip posters in all classrooms
- 2 Full time SRO's on campus
- AM and PM security personnel
- District is piloting a weapons detector at high schools; we anticipate a trial at our school soon
- District safety inspections
- LCSO safety inspections
- LCSO uses our campus for assailant training simulations
- Response time for a false "swatting" incident last semester was within seconds for the SRO's on campus and under 2 minutes for three LCSO street patrols; even more arrived in less than 5 minutes. Officers with drawn weapons immediately cleared the false reported "swat" area with zero hesitation.

While it is sad that this has become a topic of concern in our society, we must acknowledge the challenges presented by school safety issues. As a person with the inside track on school safety, I can assure you with confidence that we do our very best to address safety so that kids can be kids and focus on learning. A much more fun part of my job here at NFMHS is to support athletics and activities. Looking back, accomplishments have been incredible. After experiencing one of the worst tragedies in weather-related history, with Red Knight staff and students still in varied stages of recovering from the aftermath of Hurricane Ian, athletic and academic achievements prevail! We accomplished what we set out to do, including completing academic tasks and testing, completing seasons for all of our Fall and Winter athletics teams and holding more SGA student activities, Clubs, JROTC, Arts, Theater and Dance events than ever. Among all of the many accolades our students achieve I would most like to highlight our athletic teams' levels of academic success. The FSHAA ranks each team by GPA (grade averages) and publishes the top 50 highest academically ranking in the state for each sport. Check out the



#### STUDENT GOVERNMENT NEWS




These students auditioned and got into the All County Orchestra – this is an advanced orchestra featuring players from the entire school district. North has the most participants in the orchestra this year!



#### SENIOR FINAL EXAM EXEMPTION CRITERIA 2022-23

The following exam exemption policy applies to SENIORS ONLY. If you have a SENIOR who meets the exemption criteria, the student receives an NG for the exam in FOCUS. This policy excludes Dual Enrollment, AP, IB, or AICE Exams.

## Seniors who meet the following criteria are EXEMPT from final exams:

- Only Seniors can waive second semester exams.
- Student must have an A or B average in the class for the second semester and be eligible to earn credit.
- Student must have no external suspensions during semester 2.
- Advanced Placement, IB, AICE, and Dual Enrollment exams must be administered. No exemptions can be given for these courses.
- . When an exam is waived, the two nine-week grades for second semester will be averaged to obtain a semester average for the course.
- Only those seniors who meet the criteria as stated above will be exempt from exams at the end of second semester.


