## **Graduation Requirements**

#### 4 Credits English Language Arts (ELA)

- ELA 1, 2, 3, 4
- ELA honors, Advanced Placement (AP), Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE), International Baccalaureate (IB) and dual enrollment courses may satisfy this requirement

#### **4 Credits Mathematics**

- One of which must be Algebra 1 and one of which must be Geometry
- Industry certifications\* that lead to college credit may substitute for up to two
  mathematics credits (except for Algebra 1 and Geometry)
- An identified computer science credit may substitute for up to one mathematics credit (except for Algebra 1 and Geometry)\*\*

#### **3 Credits Science**

- One of which must be Biology 1, two of which must be equally rigorous science courses
- Two of the three required course credits must have a laboratory component
- Industry certifications that lead to college credit may substitute for up to one science credit (except for Biology 1)
- An identified computer science course may substitute for up to one science credit (except for Biology 1)\*\*\*

#### **3 Credits Social Studies**

- 1 credit in World History
- 1 credit in U.S. History
- 0.5 credit in U.S. Government
- 0.5 credit in Economics

#### 1 Credit Fine and Performing Arts, Speech and Debate, or Practical Arts\*\*

#### 1 Credit Physical Education

To include the integration of health.

#### **8 Elective Credits**

#### 1 Online Course Within the 24 Credits\*\*\*\*

Students must earn a 2.0 grade-point average on a 4.0 scale and pass statewide, standardized assessments unless a waiver of assessment results is granted by the IEP team for students with disabilities.

- ☐ Florida Medallion Scholars (FMS) will receive an award to cover 75% of tuition and applicable fees when attending a public postsecondary institution.
  - \*\*Beginning in fall 2021, students enrolled in an associate degree program at a Florida College System institution will receive an award to cover 100% of tuition and applicable fees.

Students must earn either the required volunteer service **OR** paid work hours, but not a combination of both.

Students must submit Bright Futures Service Hours paperwork and documentation to their School Counselor.
